Willow Class




Willow class have made an amazing start to the year across the curriculum. In English, the children have read a selection of books including Cave Baby, How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth and Tyrannosaurus Drip. They have all engaged well in the stories predicting what might happen at the end as we have been reading along and writing their character descriptions using alliteration, expanded noun phrases and rhyme.

This term in Maths, Willow class have been working on their multiplication and division skills using grouping and sharing to make equal groups. They have all been improving their times tables because of this!

For our topic this term, we have gone through the ages from the Stone Age to the Iron Age learning about how they

lived and survived. We went on a trip to Bishop's Wood where we took part in fire-making,

hunting, and scavenging activities. Also, they have used brilliant creativity in creating their own Round Houses out of cardboard and straw, and Stonehenge out of biscuits!



Cedar Class

This term Cedar class have continued their study of The Tudors. We took part in a re-enactment of Henry VIII's marriages, learning about the fates of each of Henry's wives and marriages. Further to this, we learnt about gruesome



Tudor punishments.

In our Science lessons, we have been carrying out experiments, testing how exercise effects the human body. For English, Cedar have been focusing on our re-tells of stories about friendship, love, travel and grief through our study of Home Sweet Home and Lost and Found.

Maple Class

This half term as always has been a busy one for Maple Class.

In Literacy we read 'How to wash a woolly mammoth'. The children thoroughly enjoyed this story and created diaries story maps and created puppets based on the story for a final story retell. We are currently reading the enchanting book 'The Night box'. The children are thoroughly engaged with exploring the contents of the night box and have created some amazing writing as a result. We have continued our learning about Prehistoric times and moved onto learning about the Bronze Age. We have learnt about everyday life in the Bronze Age and how it progressed from the Stone Age.

In Science we have performed some exciting experiments about Light and Dark. The children have used torches and mirrors to investigate light and shadows. We are growing and maturing as a class and are working together as a team. On a snowy day this term we worked together to create snowmen which was lovely to observe. We have also visited Sycamore Play centre and took part in creating cave paintings and other outdoor activities such as archery and den building.



This term in Elm we have had visits out, visitors in as well as learned a lot since starting the new Academic Year in September including a visit from our local PCSO and asked many questions about our rights and responsibilities now we are turning 10. We were also visited by a Magician which we all enjoyed tremendously, especially as we all received a balloon model to take home.

In Maths we have been securing our knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as well as new skills such as line graphs and reading timetables. We have practiced how to read mathematical problems and will be able take on further trickier challenges throughout the rest of the academic year. In English we have read stories based on The Anglo Saxons and The Vikings including Norse myths including Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo, Thor's Magic Hammer and Erik the Viking by Terry Deary. We have written a range of text types including Newspapers, Diaries, Letters, Adventure stories and Stories that are based on familiar stories we know but we have enjoyed changing the plot or characters to add our own ideas. We have developed how we describe characters and settings really well and have got so many golden tickets and stickers for impressing the teachers with our writing.

Topic work has taken us through invasions on the UK throughout History from the Anglo-Saxons, Vikings to the Norman Invasion of 1066 at the Battle of Hastings. We learned about place names and words that are used today that come directly from Anglo Saxon, Viking or Norman settlers. We have also learned about the start of the monarchy in Britain with Saxon Kings, Viking rulers and then the battle for the throne from European invaders. Our Trip to Bishops wood helped us learn how Anglo Saxons and Vikings lived, how they worked and what daily life was like. We even had a go at making our own Bronze broach in the traditional way.

Art work has been a real big enjoyment for. We learned all about the impact of colour and have it in our own works in the style of artists including Gaugin, Van Gogh, Kandinsky and Lichtenstein. We used contrasting, complimentary, primary and secondary colour schemes. We have used many different methods of creating art work including crayons, felt pens, wax crayons, paint, watercolour paint, clay and collage. Through our Viking unit we also experimented with weaving. We created our own wall hangings. It took a lot or patience and perseverance and we are proud of our efforts.



Oak class have settled in really well and had an amazing Autumn term. In English, we have been writing factual reports, stories and even writing and posting a letter. In maths we have learned about the relationships between numbers and had fun working with shapes. In topic we have learned about learned about London, creating maps and learning about landmarks. In our science lessons we have been learning all about animals and we were lucky enough to have 5 super visits to a local farm where Oak Class showed super behaviour and had the opportunity to walk alpacas and groom Shetland ponies. A super start to a new school year, well done Oak Class.

Sports

During the Autumn term, the children have studied the topic of "Ball skills", children took part in a range of different ball games. Football, Knock the Cone and Basketball are just some of the ball games children took part in. The aim was to work on children's basic hand-eye co-ordination and team building skills.

During the second part of the Autumn term, we studied the topic of "Healthy Lifestyle". Children have been learning about what makes a good balanced diet, and what nutrients different foods give to the body. Children have also planned their own fitness sessions that they have led for their classes to promote a healthy lifestyle.
